Flu vaccination Programme (also sent via email 6.09.24)

We will be visited by the intrahealth team who will administer the flu vaccination on the morning of 25/09/2024. Your child can only receive the vaccination if you consent via the online consent form.

If you have not already completed the form, please see below the link for the flu vaccination consent forms, this link is now open and will close at midnight on the **18**th **September for clinical triage**.

The vaccination in most cases is given by a simple spray up the nose, for those parents/guardians who object to the nasal vaccine on the grounds of porcine gelatine content or dietary requirements, an alternative vaccination (injection) is also available.

When you click on the consent link, there are contact details for intrahealth, if you have any questions about the vaccination. There are also links for further information, when you click on the link.

If you wish to answer no to consent there is an option for this through the link. Intrahealth will only administer though if you consented through one of the yes options on the online form.

Uniform

Thank you for all of your support in following our school uniform expectations. The children are looking really smart and ready to learn.

The uniform expectations are available on the website for further reference, but please see the guidance below:

- Sweatshirt / Cardigan green with school logo.
- Polo Shirt yellow plain polo shirt
- Skirts/Trousers grey / black skirt or pinafore or grey / black trousers.
- Socks: grey, black or white.
- Tights: grey or black.
- Shoes: plain black school shoes only (no trainers/boots
- No jewellery. No earrings allowed. A watch is allowed to be worn but no smart watches are allowed.
- PE Kit all children must have a PE kit in school.

This consists of:

• Black PE Pumps (indoor PE), trainers for (outdoor PE), black shorts and plain yellow t-shirt.
